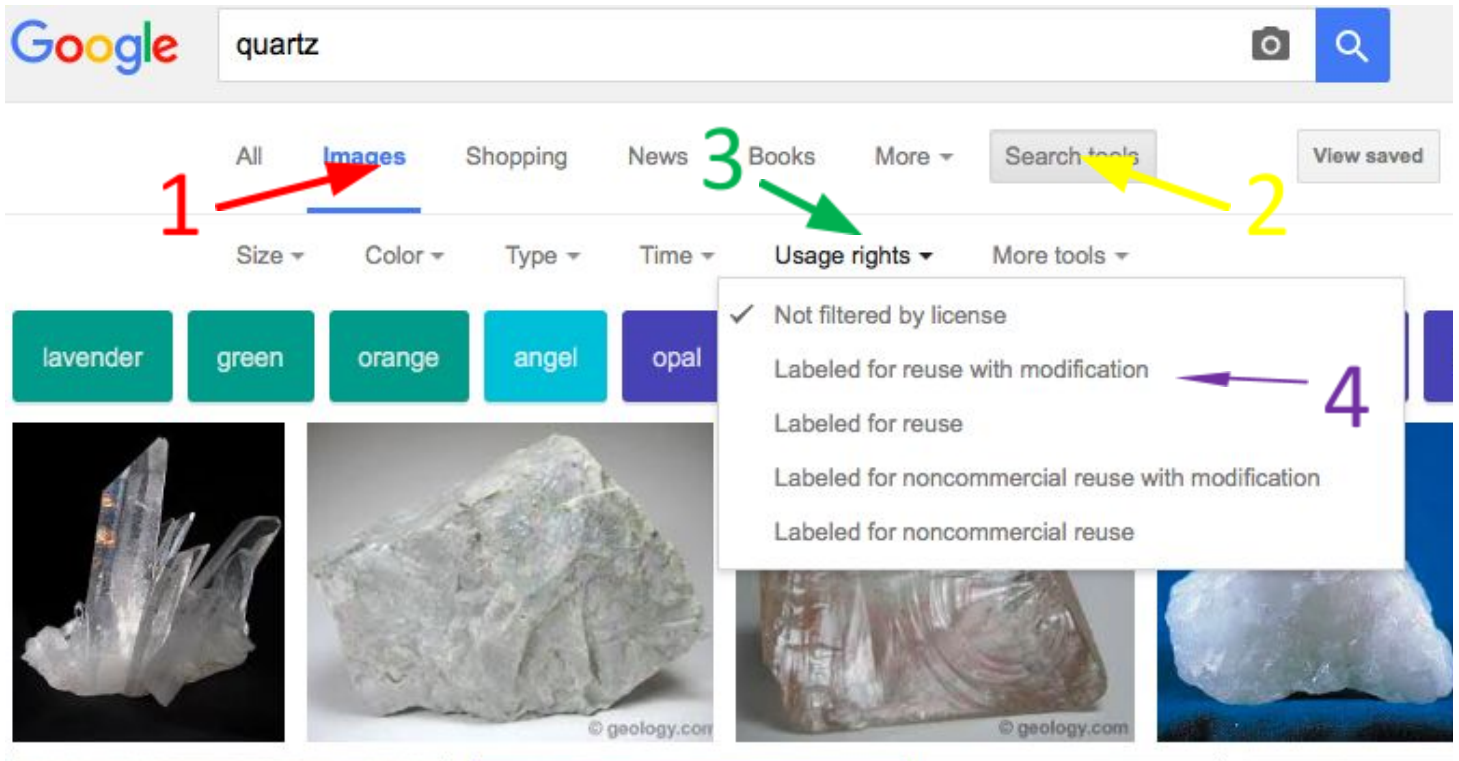


How to Find and Cite OER Images

For Finding an Image

Open a web browser and go to www.google.com, type in what you are searching for a picture of and hit enter

1. Click on “Images”
2. Click on “Search Tools”
3. Click on “Usage Rights”
4. Click on “Labeled for reuse with modification”



For Citation:

- When you select an image, you will be taken to the site where it is stored (can be Wikipedia, Pixabay, Flickr, etc.). On each of the sites you will find the information required to cite the image correctly.
- Most OER images use a creative commons license. A proper citation looks like:

[Authors Name, Creative Commons License (linked to license description), Link to the Original Work]

For example an OER image is at: https://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/File:Quartz,_Tibet.jpg

- Scroll down the page to the Summary and Licensing Areas to find the author and license (called permission on the page)
- The citation for this image would be: (JJ Harrison, [CC-BY-SA-2.5](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-sa/2.5/), [Link to image](https://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/File:Quartz,_Tibet.jpg))
- For some licenses you must note if changes were made to the original work, so if I modified the image I would cite it as: Modified from (JJ Harrison, [CC-BY-SA-2.5](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-sa/2.5/), [Link to original](https://commons.wikimedia.org/wiki/File:Quartz,_Tibet.jpg))

Lastly, licensing your work based on other’s OER works can be confusing. You can ask questions to:
